Dear Parents,



This Sunday many of our Year 6 students will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. It is with immense pride that we witness this significant milestone in their spiritual journey, one that marks a deeper commitment to their Catholic faith and a reaffirmation of their baptismal promises. Yesterday we were visited by Bishop Terry Curtin who, with Father Denis, will confirm the children at St Patrick's Cathedral. I especially loved Bishop Terry's comment that where there is reverence there is room for everyone.

Confirmation is a sacred sacrament in the Catholic Church, where individuals receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit, empowering them to live out their faith courageously and authentically in the world. In preparation for this sacrament, our students have undergone a period of spiritual formation and reflection, guided by their dedicated teachers and parents.

The sacrament of Confirmation is not the end but rather the beginning of a lifelong journey of discipleship. As our students receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit—wisdom, understanding, courage, knowledge, reverence, right judgement and wonder and awe—they are called to bear witness to Christ in their words and actions, to be agents of love, compassion, and justice in the world.

Lord Jesus, as our students receive the sacrament of Confirmation, we pray that you fill their hearts with your love and grace. Grant them the gifts of the Holy Spirit To guide them, strengthen them, and inspire them in their journey of faith. May they always walk in your light and be witnesses of your love in the world around them. Amen.


