Dear Parents,

How lovely it has been to have some sunshine this week. It definitely put everyone in a better mood! With several staff members away at the moment, it is all hands on deck to ensure the smooth running of the school but everyone is pitching in and doing a wonderful job!

Today we celebrate the Feast of St Mary of the Cross Mackillop who is very special to our school. You may have noticed the quote in our office foyer: "Be full of forgiveness, love and hope". These are great words to guide the way we live our lives and are qualities we try to instil in our students.

The following reflection comes from our Parish Bulletin:



1916 the first of a fine tradition of altogether eighty-six sisters arrived at the re-quest of the Parish Priest Fr John Gallivan through Sister Andrea the Provincial for the Sisters of St Joseph to teach the 106 pupils at St Mary's school in Sunbury. With the sisters came dedication to St Mary Mackillop's vision of service; some to

teach, and some in a Parish pastoral role of visiting the sick and aged. The community of sisters ranged from six to one but always here to serve. Their role has always been very much driven by the needs of the Parish. The Parish needed and the sisters responded. Many of our Parishioners when asked will relate that their primary education was very much at the guidance of the good sisters. Many others will relate their memories of Sister visiting them, their families, their parents just as a drop in or in a time of special need.

St Mary MacKillop fought poverty and ignorance. She established her community of sisters to educate and care for the poor and the needy, in particular children, regard-less of religion or race. St Mary's life is a reminder for us to avoid complacency; build on our successes and address issues of poverty, ignorance and injustice. The life and dedication of our sisters in our community is a living example for us as individuals and as a Parish. One of their many living legacies is reflected in the leadership of Sr Helen Barnes working with our parishioners to develop our Parish Prayer which continues to challenge us today and tomorrow.

"God our Father, bless this parish of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, so that we may love you more. Help the parents to be a good example to their children and our youth to grow in strength as good Christians. Encircle our families with your loving care. To the sick grant health, to the aged bring serenity, and to those in sorrow, joy. May we grow stronger in faith and may our love for one another become deeper in our daily living .... Amen.

# **Bullying No Way!**

National Week of Action 12th-16th August - Week 5

# The 2024 theme is 'Everyone Belongs'

When we feel like we belong, bullying struggles to find a place. It's about embracing who we are, respecting everyone's differences and standing up together against unkindness. Belonging means we all have a role in preventing bullying. We're encouraged to speak up and create a safe place where everyone feels supported and respected, and our voices are heard and valued.

We will kickstart this 'Week of Action' tomorrow during House Teams, where students will be introduced to the 2024 suite of media and activities that celebrate diversity and promote acceptance.

In classes across Week 5, students will participate in discussions and activities that encompass diversity, stereotypes, promote empathy, foster positive relationships and support provision.

## **Social Stencil Program**

Over the course of Term 2 and continuing into Term 3, our grade 3-5 students have participated in weekly sessions based on understanding and strengthening friendships. Navigating the social arena can be extremely rewarding, challenging and at times confusing. Social Stencil has provided students with common language regarding friendship styles and other aspects of socialization. The advantages and disadvantages of '2 peas in a pod', 'group style', 'bouncy ball' and 'just me' have been explored. Students have identified their current preferred style and learned these are fluid and change over time and friendships. Our group work activities have assisted students to highlight actions that support friendships to flourish, and the role 'care' and 'good company' has in aiding relationships to float along and even fly. Your child will be able to tell you what can contribute to friendships 'flopping over' hint: 3 F's - Fortune, Fame and Fear!

Over the next four weeks we will be embarking on strategies to use to break free from 'The Drama Triangle' and the roles that are played in such events. A situation we can all find ourselves, in times of conflict or disagreement with friends. Problem solving and assertiveness sessions are just two strategies we will explore.

There are modules of this program that will be adapted and delivered over 1-2 sessions with our grade 1/2 cohort and grade 6's have experienced some content, as well as exploring our Resilient Project Student Data. The focus being on further improving the wellbeing of our students, with ideas and strategies voiced by our student leaders regarding their own data.

As you can see, there has been lots happening in the Social Stencil space and it has been exciting to lead the students through this amazing program designed by Psychologist Connie Buckingham.




